1.	CHAIRMAN'S OPENING REMARKS AND APOLOGIES	
	The meeting was formally opened by Councillor Gwilym Evans the Chair. Apologies were received from the following, Councillor Nia Jones and Councillor Iwan Harding.	CLERK
1.1	No public participation.	
1.2	Consultation on the Single Transferable Vote System by Gwynedd Council - support but with comments - Councillor Rhys ap Gwilym is forwarding the comments to Gwynedd Council.	RhaG
1.3	Tŷ Newydd Warden Street Llanberis - the development of building a residential house on Warden Street was discussed as a request before a formal planning application was submitted. It was decided to support the development and acknowledge that it is important to support local people and as a result to support the use of the Welsh language and to ensure that local children attend the local school.	
1.4	Sheep and ongoing weeds - the matter was discussed once again and it was decided at the outset that the Clerk would send a formal request to Gwynedd Council for them to carry out maintenance work on the 'Cattle Grids' located on county lanes within the village limits. Consultation with bodies to see what can be done to resolve the situation and even to see what the responsibilities are for farmers regarding sheep that roam the village. The Council recognized that people are suffering because of their noise, their mess and that they are damaging walls and eating flowers and vegetables.	
1.5	Camping in unsuitable places - Wild camping has been happening on the land of Dolbadarn Castle over the summer. The Council decided that the Clerk would send the evidence to CADW.	
1.6	The walls up the gap are full of holes that allow visitors to access parking in the fields. The Clerk to send to Gwynedd Council and the National Park.	
1.7	The Glyn is raising concerns for the Council because there is no evidence of enforcement happening there - The Clerk to send to Parc Padarn for clarification.

4.3	Memorial Sculpture of the Quarrymen - a work progressing to try to overcome problems with wires and underground services at the proposed location.	CLERK
4.4	HBO panel - no follow-up since the panel meeting and received location minutes have been determined. Information has been sent to the appropriate officer in order to proceed with the application.	CLERK
4.5	Memorial Statue of the Quarrymen - the latest information about the statue was given to the Council by the Clerk.	
4.6	HBO Fund - application invitation period for grants for projects under £2500 or over £2500 starting from the 14th of September until the 1st of December 2024. Posters have been made and they will be distributed by Councillor Trystan Thomas.	RhaG/CLERK
4.7	Outdoor Gym - an application has been submitted and it is hoped to hear something within the week.	
4.8	Menter/Llanberis Partnership Dyffryn Peris Partnership - Councillor Rhys ap Iwilym and the Clerk to decide on a date to hold a meeting for community engagement and bodies within Llanberis and Nant Peris.	
4.9	Toilets - information was provided to the Council regarding the annual invoice for the toilets. The invoice was £12,000 for the three toilets within Llanberis. Last year only £6,000 was invoiced because a scheme was in place that a parking unit would contribute 10% of the parking spaces towards the costs of the toilets. Unfortunately, there is no evidence that the Council is part of this scheme. The Council will now ensure that they are part of the scheme for 2025-2026. There was little discussion regarding the adoption of the toilets. This will be a matter for further discussion in due course.	
4.10	Bus Station Maes Padarn - the work to restore the building will be completed within the week.	
4.11	The Clerk gave an explanation to the Council as to why the extension of the licenses for Becws Melyn and Dolbadarn Hotel was rejected.	

4.12	Llyn Padarn - the Clerk said that Gwynedd Council (Padarn Park) hopes to introduce hessian mats to kill the weeds by smothering them.	
4.13	Coed y Ddol events - although information has come to light that vehicles have used Cae Coed y Ddol and that litter has been left behind, Padarn Park stated that this was not true.	
4.14	A virtual meeting has been arranged with a Gwynedd Council officer to discuss traffic and parking issues.
